Hi Kim:

Attached please find a proposed Agreement for another extension of the Franchise with Comcast. The Cable Commission is recommending that the City Council approve the Extension Agreement. The Agreement will extend the expiration date of the current Franchise from March 31, 2019 to August 31, 2019. The purpose of the proposed extension is to allow for continued informal negotiations between Comcast and the Cable Commission regarding the long-term renewal of the Franchise. Comcast is in agreement with this.

The extension is necessary in part due to Comcast being unable to meet for negotiations in the past two months, including due to illness of one of its key negotiation participants.

Background

As you know, the Cable Commission has been working on the matter of Franchise renewal with Comcast given that the existing Franchise Agreement that is set to expire March 31, 2019. The Commission and Comcast have been in direct negotiations for approximately a year, and prior to that, the Commission had developed and documented a comprehensive needs assessment to serve as the negotiation objective on behalf of member cities. The needs assessment report is available at:

Renewal issues can be resolved through "informal" processes (negotiation), or through a "formal" hearing process. Based on the time required to complete the formal process, the Commission has adopted and updated two schedules. In both, the parties start with negotiations, but move the formal process forward so that it would be completed by roughly the date scheduled for franchise expiration if negotiations were not successful. One schedule assumed that the expiration date stayed as is (March 31, 2019), and effectively required the parties to reach negotiated deal points by mid October. In the other, the parties would extend the franchise to give themselves more time to engage in negotiations.

Recommendation to Approve Extension

The Cable Commission and Comcast have exchanged proposed terms and counterproposals and held several negotiation sessions over the past year. While no proposed deal has yet been reached, both parties recommend extending the time schedule to allow for continuation of negotiations. Therefore, the parties have agreed to recommend extending the franchise expiration date to August 31, 2019 in order to allow negotiations to continue to proceed informally.

To accomplish this, Cable Commission recommends that the City approve the attached Extension Agreement. The Cable Commission believes this simple extension of the current franchise expiration will allow both parties to continue informal negotiations without being put at a disadvantage. The extension preserves the City's right to use the I-NET, and preserves existing support and channels (including high definition channels) for local cable programming. It does not harm the communities in any way.

Finally, please find attached a revised the franchise renewal schedule to reflect how the timeline proceeds under this extension. The Commission leadership believes it is important to follow this schedule to protect the interests of its Member Municipalities.

EXTENSION AGREEMENT BETWEEN AND AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE RAMSEY WASHINGTON SUBURBAN CABLE COMMISSION AND COMCAST OF MINNESOTA

WHEREAS, Comcast of Minnesota, Inc., ("Franchisee") operates a cable television system (the "System") in communities which are members of the Ramsey/Washington Suburban Cable Commission (RWSCC) pursuant to a franchise scheduled to expire on November 1, 2018, to which the City of Birchwood Village, the City of Dellwood, the City of Grant, the City of Lake Elmo, the City of Mahtomedi, the City of North St. Paul, the City of Oakdale, the City of Vadnais Heights, the City of White Bear Lake, White Bear Township and the City of Willernie, Minnesota, are parties (each community is a "Franchisor"); a March 9, 1995 Memorandum of Understanding; and the April 10, 2014 Settlement Agreement, as amended by Section 2 of that certain 2015 Transfer Agreement Between and Among The Members of the Ramsey Washington Suburban Cable Commission, Comcast of Minnesota, Inc. and Midwest Cable, Inc. (collectively, the Franchise and these documents are the "Franchise Documents"); and

WHEREAS, the parties previously agreed to extend the expiration date of the Franchise, and of obligations in the Settlement Agreement, through March 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to extend certain time periods provided under the Franchise Documents to provide time for the parties to work together to attempt to resolve renewal issues,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Franchise is extended through and including August 31, 2019.
- Section 2. Paragraph 10 of the "Settlement Agreement Regarding PEG Capacity" is amended so that the reference to March 31, 2019 is changed to August 31, 2019.
- Section 3. Otherwise, the Franchise Documents shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with their terms.
- Section 4. Both parties agree that the further extension will not require recommencement of the renewal process under state or federal law, or require either party to re-conduct any studies or proceedings that may have been or are being conducted.
- Section 5. This Extension Agreement does not confer upon the Franchisee any additional rights under Section 626 of the Cable Act.
- Section 6. By entering into this Extension Agreement, the parties do not otherwise waive their rights to rely upon the rights, procedures, protections and recourses granted to them pursuant to applicable Federal, state, or local rule, regulation, law or precedent.
- Section 7. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement

- (c) Painting on walls, fences, trees, etc. Signs shall not be painted directly on the outside wall of a building. Signs shall not be painted on a fence, tree, stone or other similar objects in any district.

Sec. 32-404. Offensive signs.

Private traffic circulation signs and traffic warning signs in alleys, parking lots or in other hazardous situations may be allowed on private property provided that such signs do not exceed three square feet and are used exclusively for traffic control purposes.

Sec. 32-407. Private signs in right-of-way.

Private signs, other than public utility warning signs, are prohibited within the public right-of-way of any street or way or other public property. (Ord. No. 50, § 727.07, 12-7-1982)

Sec. 32-408. Illuminated signs.

- (a) Prohibitions. Illuminated signs may be permitted, but flashing signs, except ones giving time, date, temperature, weather or similar public service information, shall be prohibited. Signs giving off intermittent, rotating or directional light which may be confused with traffic, aviation or emergency signaling are prohibited.
- (b) Direction of light rays. Illuminated signs shall be diffused or indirect so as not to direct rays of light into adjacent property or onto any public street or way.
- (c) Distance from rights-of-way, etc. No illuminated signs or their support structures shall be located closer than 25 feet to a roadway surface or closer than ten feet to a road right-of-way line or property line, notwithstanding more restrictive portions of this section.

Sec. 32-409. Political signs.

Political signs are allowed in any district on private property with the consent of the owner of the property. Such signs must be removed within ten days following the date of the election or elections to which they apply.



In response to your request for sign removal, please see below our communication to the public regarding sign removal in County right of ways, as directed by our County Engineer.

- 1) Our next formal sign sweep is scheduled for Wednesday, November 7th
- 2) We do NOT have any formal sign sweeps scheduled between now and election day (Nov 6)
- 3) We WILL respond to a sign complaint if it presents an immediate safety issue. For example if a sign blocks sight lines along the road or at an intersection, or if the sign is affixed to one of our traffic control devices, we will remove it.
- 4) All other signs that are in place but are placed away from the road to either be on private property, or to not present an immediate public safety issue, will be left in place. We will deal with these signs during our November 7th sign sweep (or the candidate may remove them after the election is complete)
- 5) Any sign not along a county road will need to be referred to the proper road authority.

Mr. Lanoux:

I received this email from you yesterday and then later received a voice mail demanding a response.

The City of Grant, like all cities, acts as and when it reasonably can in receiving, evaluating and sometimes acting upon particular complaints. These steps are dependent on a number of factors-including, here the fact that what might otherwise be a routine seasonal complaint here is laced with an apparent threat of "costly litigation", the matter of actual "right of way" location, staff resources and scheduling.

I will evaluate your request (and your apparent threat of litigation) and, after doing so, will forward your request to the appropriate party for routine handling (subject to the above factors) but nobody, in this City or any other, reasonably demands "immediate" removal of complained-about signs and nobody, in this City or any other, assures anyone of "immediate" their removal. This is so for a variety of factors (again, listed above), and including the fact that the "right of way" in rural areas like Grant is not always objectively identifiable or if objectively identifiable, is not subject to "immediate" identification.

The above considerations are not new and they prevail in all cities. Noting that you have copied your lawyers on this matter I can only assume (perhaps wrongly however) that they had some involvement in reviewing the specifics and nature of your email and demand before you issued it. It is puzzling to me that any lawyer with a background in these matters would furnish their implicit or express endorsement of a demand and threat like the one you issued here on the grounds it was issued. They can certainly provide me with their explication for it in formal correspondence however. Counsel for Mr. Lanoux, I ask that you please do so by Friday of this week. Thank you.

WHEREAS, the City of Grant will conduct Primary and General Elections in 2012; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grant is a politically active community in which residents routinely express their support for candidates by displaying political signs on private property; and WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota has enacted statutes including the Minnesota Outdoor Advertising Control Act regulating the placement, painting, printing or affixing of advertisements including outdoor signage ("State Statutes"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Grant has adopted a sign ordinance regulating the placement of signs within the City's corporate jurisdiction ("City Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Grant's sign ordinance is currently identified as ordinances 32-418, 32-419, 32-420, 32-421 and 32-422 of the Grant Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to notify candidates for political office and their supporters that all campaign signs located in the City prior to and immediately following the Primary or General election are required to strictly comply with the requirements of the State Statute-and the City Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council for the City of Grant as follows:

- 1. All candidates for public office, and their supporters, are hereby notified that all campaign signs erected in the City of Grant are required to comply with the State Statutes and City Ordinance regulating the placement of campaign signs. Where the State Statutes and the City Ordinances overlap or conflict, the State Statutes govern and control the placement of signs within the City of Grant.
- 2. All candidates for public office, and their supporters, are hereby notified that all campaign signs erected in the City of Grant are required to comply with the City Ordinance regulating the placement of signs including, which is currently identified as Ordinances 32-418, 32-419, 32-420, 32-421 and 32- 422. To the extent the City Ordinance is modified or amended, all

candidates for public office and their supports are required to comply with the modified and amended ordinances,

- 3. During the period beginning 46 days prior to the State Primary and concluding 10 days following the State General Election, all noncommercial signs of any size may be posted in any number in accordance with Minnesota, Stat. 211B.045. Aside from the size and number of campaign signs, during such period of time, all posted signs remain subject to the regulation the Statutes and the City Ordinance.
- 4. The City of Grant reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to remove any sign posted in violation of the State Statutes or City Ordinance.

Dear Ms. Welander:

The City of Grant has received a formal complaint regarding the sign located on your property at the corner of 75°. St and Manning Ave., across street from Axidahis Garden Center. Parcel # 250302113001.

The sign indicates "Wildlife Control" The sign appeared to be located within the road -right- of way, however with checking with the county road- right- of- way administrator it was noted to be located within your property boundaries.

The City of Grant ordinance requires a sign permit for the placement or installation of signs. The city records indicate that no sign permit was issued for this sign. I understand this sign has been in place for a substantial amount of time, however there is no provision for a "Grandfather" exception.

The ordinance requires a sign permit for the sign to remain in-place. The sign when approved by a permit shall conform to the regulations set forth by the ordinance.

Currently the sign is considered an obsolete sign, which by ordinance language means they shall be taken down and removed within 30 days after written notice from the zoning administrator.

If you wish to maintain the sign, please make application for a sign permit, however take into consideration the requirements noted in the ordinance.






These signs are in right of way as the entire right of way is located behind the tree/ brush line.


They were allowed along with all the other illegally place signs to remain until after the election giving a unfair advantage over their opponents that honored the Fair Campaign Practice manual received.

The home owner did not give permission to place signs in right way and the state and county cannot give permission to place signs in right of way.




Note This sign was placed in front of Road Right of Way marker after the county removed the News in grant.com earlier.


