Consideration of Resolution No. 2019-06 Revised Assessment Policy – City Engineer Reifsteck advised the new special assessment policy will provide more detailed guidelines for addressing special assessments in the City as follows:

• The city may contribute budgeted roadway maintenance dollars to the project.

 • The City encourages all neighborhoods within the feasibility study to participate in the project to benefit from the economy of scale of a much larger competitively bid construction project.

• No special assessments will be levied against the City of Grant unless the owned property meets the definition of a buildable lot.

• Defines the term "reconstruct" for all roadways in terms of improving its section or surface.

 Defines the term "project" to encompass all roadway segments ordered by Council into a single project.

Assessments are allocated on a per project basis

Includes paved roads as part of the procedures
The City agrees to initially pay for the cost of the feasibility report.

• Property owners representing 50% of the units proposed to be assessed approve the project, then the project will be ordered.

• The feasibility report is valid for up to 3 years.

• Property owners petitioning the City after 3 years from Council reception and acceptance of the initial feasibility report will be responsible for the cost of a new feasibility Report.

City Engineer Reifsteck noted the feasibility studies have been the hurdle at the neighborhood meetings and properties cannot be assessed for any more than the value of the property increases due to the improvements.

Council Member Giefer moved to adopt Resolution No. 2019-06, as presented. Council Member Kaup seconded the motion. Motion carried with Council Member Carr and Rog voting nay.

- PUBLIC HEARING, Consideration of Ordinance No. 2019-59, Amendment to Chapter 28 to Incorporate Aesthetic Standards, Small Cell Wireless City Planner Swanson advised Staff has prepared an ordinance regarding Small Cell Wireless Facilities for your review in consideration. In late 2017 the City enacted and adopted Article IV pertaining to management of the City's Rights-of-Way which, in part, was meant to address the permitting process for Small Cell Wireless Facilities. Throughout 2018, the Small Cell Wireless Facility operators were engaged with the FCC and the legislature to further restrict a municipality's ability to permit and regulate Small Cell Wireless
- legislature to furtheFacility installation.

- After various rulings, new requirements have been established, several of which are addressed within
- the attached ordinance. The ordinance included in the packets is consistent with Minnesota Rules,
- and address the following:
- Permitting processes and timelines;
- Aesthetic standards;
- Collocation of facilities; and

- The City Attorney is in the process of reviewing the draft ordinance and will provide verbal updates and/or suggested modifications at the City Council meeting. The City must adopt its aesthetic
- standards by April 15, 2019 in compliance with the FCC ruling.

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

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

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Independent Contractor Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into as of the 7th day of May, 2019, by and between the CITY OF GRANT, a Minnesota municipal corporation ("GRANT") and KEJ Enterprises, Inc. ("CONTRACTOR").

Recitals

- A. GRANT is a Minnesota municipal corporation with its City Hall located at 111 Wildwood Road, Willernie, Minnesota 55090.
- B. CONTRACTOR desires to assist GRANT as an independent contractor in providing professional consulting services to GRANT clients and GRANT desires to retain CONTRACTOR upon the terms and conditions hereafter set forth.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are true and correct and incorporated herein and the mutual obligations set forth below, GRANT and CONTRACTOR hereby agree as follows:

Agreement

1. Performance by CONTRACTOR

GRANT engages CONTRACTOR to furnish the services described in the Statement of Work attached to this Agreement, and incorporated herein by reference as **Exhibit A** and CONTRACTOR agrees to provide Roadway Contractor services (the "Services") specified in the Statement of Work. CONTRACTOR will principally manage the completion of the Services in the Scope of Work. GRANT has contracted with a number of contractors who have historically provided services to GRANT for work on its roadways. CONTRACTOR will manage roadway projects and contractors, serve as the GRANT liaison for roadway projects and will field resident concerns and complaints regarding roadways located within GRANT.

2. Payment for Services

- a. Fees. GRANT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR for the Services at a negotiated rate in accordance with the Rate Schedule attached and incorporated herein as **Exhibit B**.
- b. Out-of-Pocket Expenses. Except as agreed by GRANT, CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the performance of the Services on behalf of GRANT.
- c. *Invoices*. CONTRACTOR shall invoice GRANT monthly for Services rendered during the previous month in accordance with the Rate Schedule attached as **Exhibit B**.
- d. *Miscellaneous*. CONTRACTOR agrees to execute such affidavits and receipts as GRANT shall request in order to acknowledge payment by GRANT. CONTRACTOR

acknowledges that its federal employer tax identification number, provided to GRANT is correctly set forth in the Statement of Work attached to this Agreement.

3. Independent Contractors

CONTRACTOR and GRANT are independent of one another and neither party's employees will be considered employees of the other party for any purpose. This Agreement does not create a joint venture or partnership, and neither party has the authority to bind the other to any third party. GRANT shall have no right to direct or control CONTRACTOR with respect to CONTRACTOR'S activities hereunder. CONTRACTOR acknowledges, understands and agrees:

- a. CONTRACTOR will not be treated as an employee of GRANT for purposes of the Federal Insurance Contributions Act, the Social Security Act, the Federal Unemployment Act, income tax withholding and applicable state laws, including, without limitation, those pertaining to workers' compensation, unemployment compensation and state income tax withholding;
- b. CONTRACTOR will not qualify for any employee benefits that GRANT may now or hereafter provide to its employees including, without limitation, insurance, vacations, pension and profit sharing benefits, employee bonus programs, and the like; and
- c. Information returns will be filed with appropriate federal and state taxing authorities indicating CONTRACTOR'S status as self-employed.

4. Business of Contractor

The CONTRACTOR represents and warrants to GRANT that it is engaged in the business of providing Roadway Contractor services and has complied with all local, state, and federal laws regarding business permits and licenses that may be required to carry out such business and to perform the services specified in this Agreement. Upon request by GRANT, CONTRACTOR shall provide GRANT with copies of all documents reasonably requested by GRANT to verify the CONTRACTOR'S established business and the representations set forth herein. Notwithstanding any due diligence performed by GRANT with respect to the subject matter of these representations, CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold GRANT, Council members, agents and employees, harmless from any and all claims, causes of action, losses, damage, liabilities, costs and expenses, including attorney fees, arising from breach of the representations set forth in this Section.

5. Employees of Contractor

CONTRACTOR shall be solely responsible for paying its employees. CONTRACTOR shall be solely responsible for paying any and all taxes, FICA, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, medical insurance, life insurance, paid vacations, paid holidays,

pension, profit sharing and other benefits for the CONTRACTOR and its employees, servants and agents.

6. Obligations of CONTRACTOR

- a. Scope of Services. CONTRACTOR is required to perform the work as detailed in the Statement of Work.
- b. *Invoices*. CONTRACTOR is required to invoice GRANT as provided in the Rate Schedule for all work performed in accordance with the Statement of Work.

7. Obligations of GRANT

GRANT agrees to make available to CONTRACTOR, upon reasonable notice, such information, data and documentation required by CONTRACTOR to complete the Services.

8. Insurance

CONTRACTOR shall furnish GRANT with current certificates of coverage of the CONTRACTOR, and proof of payment by the CONTRACTOR, for workers' compensation insurance, general liability insurance, motor vehicle insurance and such other insurance as GRANT may require from time to time. GRANT shall require general liability insurance coverage of not less than \$1,000,000.00 / \$2,000,000.00. GRANT shall require automobile vehicle coverage of not less than \$500,000.00 / \$500,000.00 / \$100,000.00. GRANT shall require umbrella coverage of not less than \$1,000,000.00. CONTRACTOR shall maintain all such insurance coverage and shall furnish GRANT with certificates of renewal coverage and proofs of premium payments. If the CONTRACTOR fails to pay a premium for insurance required by this paragraph before it becomes due, GRANT may pay the premium and deduct the amount paid from any payments due the CONTRACTOR and recover the balance from the CONTRACTOR directly.

9. Termination

- a. Commencement and Renewal. This Agreement shall commence on the date set forth above and shall remain in effect for one year from date of contract. Both parties retain the ability to extend the contract for one additional year.
- b. Termination. Either party, upon giving written notice to the other party, may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days notice for any reason.
- c. Obligations Upon Expiration or Termination. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall promptly return to GRANT all copies of files, documentation, related material and any other material that is owned by GRANT.

10. Risk

CONTRACTOR shall perform the Services at its own risk. GRANT will not reimburse CONTRACTOR for any expenses incurred by CONTRACTOR as a result of services rendered under this Agreement, including, but not limited to, car-related expenses, telephone expenses, and or other business related expenses.

11. Limitation of Liability

In no event shall GRANT be liable to CONTRACTOR for the payment of any consequential, indirect, or special damages, including lost profits. CONTRACTOR acknowledges it is an independent CONTRACTOR and accepts the risks and rewards of contracting with GRANT.

12. Indemnity and Warranty

CONTRACTOR shall at all times comply with all applicable laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations and other governmental requirements. CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold GRANT, its Council members, and its agents and employees, harmless from any and all claims, causes of action, losses, damage, liabilities, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising from the death of or injury to any person, from damage to or destruction of property, or from breach of the warranties in this Section, arising from the provision of services by CONTRACTOR, its agents or employees

13. Assignment

- a. Consent Required. CONTRACTOR shall not assign or subcontract the whole or any part of this Agreement without GRANT'S prior written consent.
- b. Subcontracting. Any subcontract made by CONTRACTOR with the consent of GRANT shall incorporate by reference all the terms of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR agrees to guarantee the performance of any subCONTRACTOR used in performance of the Services.
- c. Assignment by GRANT. GRANT may assign any or all of its rights and duties under this Agreement at any time and from time to time without the consent of the CONTRACTOR.

14. Miscellaneous

a. Applicable Law and Forum. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota without regard to the conflicts of laws or principles thereof. Any action or suit related to this Agreement shall be brought in the state or federal courts sitting in Minnesota.

- b. *Notices*. Any notice or other communication required or permitted under this Agreement shall be given in writing and delivered by hand, U.S. mail or facsimile.
- c. Waiver. No waiver by GRANT of any breach by CONTRACTOR of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach of the same or any other provisions hereof. No such waiver shall be effective unless in writing and then only to the extent expressly set forth in writing.
- d. *Entire Agreement*. This Agreement, including any exhibits, constitutes the entire agreement between CONTRACTOR and GRANT.
- e. *Modifications*. No modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.
- f. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable under any statute or rule of law, the provision is to that extent to be deemed omitted, and the remaining provisions shall not be affected in any way.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, and in acknowledgment that the parties hereto have read and understood each and every provision hereof, the parties have executed this Agreement on the date first set forth above.

Background

All cities in the seven-county metropolitan area are required to update their Comprehensive Plan on a decennial basis per Minnesota Statutes 473.858, or what is commonly referred to as the Metropolitan Land Planning Act. The statute requires Cities to update their plans for conformance with the regional systems that are specified within the System Statement which is provided in advance of the preparation of the Comprehensive Plan Update.

For the past year the City has been working to prepare an update to its currently adopted 2030 Plan to respond to the requirements of the 2015 System Statement. Since a full re-write of the plan was completed in the last planning period the City Council provided direction that the 2040 Plan should be an update and use the contents of the 2030 Plan where relevant.

Based on this direction City Staff worked with the Planning Commission through a series of work sessions with two primary objectives regarding the update:

- 1. To update the 2030 Plan to incorporate the required elements of the 2015 System Statement as provided by the Metropolitan Council; and
- 2. To update the components/sections of the 2030 Plan that were no longer relevant or no longer reflected the goals and aspirations of the City for this planning period through 2040.

Based on these two objectives Staff prepared a draft 2040 Plan for consideration of the Planning Commission and City Council at a joint work session on April 16, 2019. The purpose of the work session was for the Planning Commission and City Staff to present the draft 2040 Plan to the City Council and to discuss substantive changes from the 2030 Plan. After discussion, staff requested all proposed modifications, changes, and/or edits to be submitted to staff so that a revised DRAFT 2040 Plan could be prepared and presented for consideration at the City Council's regular meeting on May 7, 2019.

Summary of Updates/Changes

After the joint work session in April City Staff received comments from one City Council member, and one Planning Commissioner after the requested deadline to submit comments making it difficult to address his



comments in the most current draft. To the extent possible, given the timing, Staff has addressed their comments and incorporated them into the most current draft which is requested to be submitted for the Adjacent/Affected Jurisdictional review period. A summary of the changes incorporated since the April DRAFT are as follows:

- More emphasis has been placed on the "Scenic Views" in the community. This phrase has been added and incorporated several times throughout the document.
- Additional strategy statements have been added to Chapter 2 to emphasize the importance of
 previous City Council and policy-maker's efforts to maintain the City's rural character to ensure such
 policies are emphasized in future planning/land use decisions.
- Reference to the sewer and water services on the Mahtomedi School Campus have been revised and updated for clarity.
- Several sentence structures and grammatical edits have been completed for clarity throughout the
 document, and in some cases to incorporate more description. While there are several changes, none
 are substantive or change the meaning of the document or the policy intent as presented at the work
 session.
- Mapping changes in Transportation Staff replaced the existing AADT Map which was incorrectly labeled in the April draft.

A link to the full PDF of the revised Plan will be emailed to the City Council in advance of the May meeting. This link will also be placed on the City's website so that the public can review the draft concurrently to the 6-month affected/adjacent jurisdictional review. Please note that an updated hardcopy will be produced for the City Council and Planning Commission once the 2040 Plan is adopted. Any revisions and updates from now until Final Adoption will be provided electronically.

Next Steps and Process

The following summary of next steps in the process are provided for your reference:

- Affected/Adjacent Jurisdictional Review Period (6-Months): Please note that the DRAFT 2040 Plan
 can be modified, updated, and revised during this review period for non-substantive issues such as
 grammar, maps, images (as discussed at the work session) and other minor changes that do not
 impact the Metropolitan Council's four regional systems.
- Response to Comments: Respond to, and incorporate if necessary, changes and comments as received during 6-month review process.
- Public Hearing: Hold public hearing on full Final DRAFT 2040 Comprehensive Plan at the Planning Commission after, or near the end, of the 6-month review period.



 City Council Approval: City Council reviews full Final Draft and incorporates changes (if applicable). Approval and authorization to submit to the Metropolitan Council is required by resolution.

<u>Action Requested:</u> Staff is requesting authorization from the City Council to submit the May DRAFT 2040 Comprehensive Plan to the required Adjacent/Affected Jurisdictions for the 6-month review period.

Attached please find a proposed Agreement for another extension of the Franchise with Comcast. The Cable Commission is recommending that the City Council approve the Extension Agreement. The Agreement will extend the expiration date of the current Franchise from August 31, 2019 to February 28, 2020. The purpose of the proposed extension is to allow for continued informal negotiations between Comcast and the Cable Commission regarding the long-term renewal of the Franchise. Comcast is in agreement with this.

Background

As you know, the Cable Commission has been working on the matter of Franchise renewal with Comcast given that the existing Franchise Agreement that is set to expire August 31, 2019. The Commission and Comcast have conducted negotiations during 2018 and 2019 thus far, and prior to that, the Commission had developed and documented a comprehensive needs assessment to serve as the negotiation objective on behalf of member cities. The needs assessment report is available at:

Renewal issues can be resolved through "informal" processes (negotiation), or through a "formal" hearing process. Based on the time required to complete the formal process, the Commission has adopted and updated two schedules. In both, the parties start with negotiations, but move the formal process forward so that it would be completed by roughly the date scheduled for franchise expiration if negotiations were not successful. One schedule assumed that the expiration date stayed as is (August 31, 2019), and effectively required the parties to reach negotiated deal points by April. In the other, the parties would extend the franchise to give themselves more time to engage in negotiations.

Recommendation to Approve Extension

The Cable Commission and Comcast have exchanged proposed terms and counterproposals and held several negotiation sessions. While no proposed deal has yet been reached, both parties recommend extending the time schedule to allow for continuation of negotiations. Therefore, the parties have agreed to recommend extending the franchise expiration date to February 28, 2020 in order to allow negotiations to continue to proceed informally.

To accomplish this, Cable Commission recommends that the City approve the attached Extension Agreement. The Cable Commission believes this simple extension of the current franchise expiration will allow both parties to continue informal negotiations without being put at a disadvantage. The extension preserves the City's right to use the I-NET, and preserves existing PEG support and channels (including high definition channels) for local cable programming. It does not harm the communities in any way.

Finally, please find attached a revised the franchise renewal schedule to reflect how the timeline proceeds under this extension. The Commission leadership believes it is important to follow this schedule to protect the interests of its Member Municipalities.

EXTENSION AGREEMENT BETWEEN AND AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE RAMSEY WASHINGTON SUBURBAN CABLE COMMISSION AND COMCAST OF MINNESOTA

WHEREAS, Comcast of Minnesota, Inc., ("Franchisee") operates a cable television system (the "System") in communities which are members of the Ramsey/Washington Suburban Cable Commission (RWSCC) pursuant to a franchise scheduled to expire on November 1, 2018, to which the City of Birchwood Village, the City of Dellwood, the City of Grant, the City of Lake Elmo, the City of Mahtomedi, the City of North St. Paul, the City of Oakdale, the City of Vadnais Heights, the City of White Bear Lake, White Bear Township and the City of Willernie, Minnesota, are parties (each community is a "Franchisor"); a March 9, 1995 Memorandum of Understanding; and the April 10, 2014 Settlement Agreement, as amended by Section 2 of that certain 2015 Transfer Agreement Between and Among The Members of the Ramsey Washington Suburban Cable Commission, Comcast of Minnesota, Inc. and Midwest Cable, Inc. (collectively, the Franchise and these documents are the "Franchise Documents"); and

WHEREAS, the parties previously agreed to extend the expiration date of the Franchise, and of obligations in the Settlement Agreement, through August 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to extend certain time periods provided under the Franchise Documents to provide time for the parties to work together to attempt to resolve renewal issues,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Franchise is extended through and including February 28, 2020.
- Section 2. Paragraph 10 of the "Settlement Agreement Regarding PEG Capacity" is amended so that the reference to August 31, 2019 is changed to February 28, 2020.
- Section 3. Otherwise, the Franchise Documents shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with their terms.
- Section 4. Both parties agree that the further extension will not require recommencement of the renewal process under state or federal law, or require either party to re-conduct any studies or proceedings that may have been or are being conducted.
- Section 5. This Extension Agreement does not confer upon the Franchisee any additional rights under Section 626 of the Cable Act.
- Section 6. By entering into this Extension Agreement, the parties do not otherwise waive their rights to rely upon the rights, procedures, protections and recourses granted to them pursuant to applicable Federal, state, or local rule, regulation, law or precedent.
- Section 7. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement
